 $Participants \ will learn the \ details of the EUR-ACE \ engineering \ programmes \ accreditation \ criteria \ and \ procedures, and the key elements of self-assessment report preparation.$

Working in groups, participants will complete exercises aimed at matching educational programme objectives with learning outcomes, determining the extent to which a course helps all students to achieve the educational programme objectives and training participants to complete a preliminary evaluation of the engineering educational programme self-assessment report.

Participants will have the chance to participate in a simulated expert visit to a university undergoing EUR-ACE accreditation, covering meetings and interviews with different stakeholders (international relations office, alumni office, students, professors, employers/ graduates of the programme under accreditation).

During this session, participants' teams will present their final project. Each team will have 10-15 minutes for a PowerPoint presentation, including a question and answer session with peers and trainers

During this closing session, trainers will assess the work done by each team, discussing strengths and weaknesses and identifying recommendations and further steps.



Guillermo Calleja (ANECA) is full professor of Chemical Engineering at the Universidad Rey Juan Carlos (URJC) in Madrid. He was founding rector of URJC, and Vice Rector for International Relations and Secretary General of the Universidad Complutense de Madrid (UCM). He received his PhD in Chemical Engineering from the UCM in 1976, is visiting scholar at the University of California-Santa Barbara (USA) and at Universidad de los Andes-Bogotá (Colombia). He was executive chairman of the Quality, Accreditation and Prospective Agency of the Universities of Madrid and member of the Advisory Council of the Spanish National Agency for Quality Assessment and Accreditation (ANECA) and is on the Board of International Advisors of Monterey Institute of International Studies (California, USA). He is ANECA delegate to the EUR-ACE Label Committee.
